Theme: Forgive us our debts (Matt. 6:12)

Bible verse: If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. (1 John 1:9)

If Christians rely on the salvation of Jesus Christ to obtain forgiveness of sins through faith and become children of God, why must we still self-reflect daily and pray to God for forgiveness? While the corruption of God's children can't overturn the fact that they have been called righteous through Jesus; if we don't pray to God for forgiveness, a gap will always exist between us and the Father. - Go reconcile with someone with whom you may have a grievance. Rely on God to restore harmony in your relationship with him/her.
